Chan eil ar leithid ann: buidheann Ghàidhlig bho bhun gu bàrr. Tha an cànan agus cultar na Gàidhlig fighte is fuaighte nar n-obair agus nar n-adhbhar, mar bhunait do gach nì a choileanas sinn.

Tha an t-àite fìor chudromach a th' aig an t-Sabhal ann an adhartachadh a' chànain follaiseach bhon a liuthad gnìomh is iomairt a bhios sinn a' gabhail os làimh. Air feadh na bliadhna seo, thug Sabhal Mòr Ostaig sùil mhionaideach air inbhe agus dleastanasan an ionaid, agus nach iomchaidh an sgrùdadh sin agus sinn gu bhith a' comharrachadh ar 50mh ceannbliadhna ann an 2023. Sa bhliadhna mhòir sin, bidh reachdas ùr air fàire airson cànanan na h-Alba agus thèid Plana Nàiseanta na Gàidhlig ùr fhoillseachadh, agus bidh àite cudromach againne an lùib nan leasachaidhean sin. Cuideachd, thèid ro-innleachd ùr fhoillseachadh airson SMO fhèin. Chaidh tòrr den obair ullachaidh is den cho-chomhairleachadh airson sin a dhèanamh ann an 2021-22.

Tha e na amas do Shabhal Mòr Ostaig a bhith na ionad acadaimigeach Gàidhlig làn misneachd agus fo stiùir ar làimhe fhìn. Mar phàirt den turas chun na h-ìre sin, bhiodh e na bu fhreagarraiche nan cuirte SMO air stèidh Ionad Foghlam Àrd-ìre le inbhe Ionad Beag Spèisealta. Fhreagradh sin na b' fheàrr air dleastanasan an ionaid agus inbhe na Gàidhlig am measg sluagh na h-Alba. Cuideachd, b' urrainn do SMO obrachadh ann an dòigh na b' èifeachdaiche gus ar prìomh amasan a choileanadh. As Scotland's National Centre for Gaelic Language and Culture, Sabhal Mòr Ostaig (SMO) has a pivotal role in Gaelic development. It is a genuinely unique institution. SMO is a Gaelic organisation from top to bottom; one in which the primacy of Gaelic language and culture is paramount, and fundamental to its function and purpose.

The breadth of SMO's activities is a vivid expression of that role. Through its leadership and contribution, SMO furthers Gaelic medium education, Gaelic research and Gaelic social and economic development as well as the Gaelic arts and culture in general.

It remains urgent work to protect, preserve and develop the Gaelic language in its traditional geographical heartlands, as well as continuing to encourage its acquisition and wide spread ubiquitous use as a community language.

Throughout this year, SMO has examined its future status and role, which is appropriate as we prepare for its 50th anniversary in 2023. That milestone year will bring the prospect of new legislation on Scotland's languages and the launch of a new National Gaelic Language Plan, in both of which SMO will play an important part. It will also see the launch of a refreshed strategy for SMO itself, on which a great deal of preparatory work and consultation has taken place during the 2021-22 year.

SMO has an ambition to become a self-governing, self-confident Gaelic academic institution. As part of that journey, conversion to Higher Education Institution status as a Small Specialist Institution would be a better reflection of SMO's function, and of the status of Gaelic in the social infrastructure of Scotland. It would also enable SMO to better focus its resources on its key mission. Continued dialogue on this topic with the Scottish Funding Council, the Scottish Government and UHI during the year has been fruitful, and in particular we have warmly welcomed UHI's expression of support for our ambition, and the SFC's and Government's continued engagement and encouragement. The impact of the Covid-19 pandemic continued to be felt in 2021-22 as adjustment to a new "normal" for on-campus and distance learning activities took place. In a yet further-constrained economic environment, it has been necessary again to be innovative and imaginative in identifying new revenue streams and in managing costs carefully. SMO continues to evolve its response to the increasingly challenging external environment, while keeping a clear focus on its core purpose.

All staff and students are to be praised in their handling of the difficult situation over this year, and in particular all those staff who have, in addition to their own duties, stepped up to cover the duties of others whether occasioned through absence or through difficulty in recruitment, which has continued to be a challenge.

Student numbers both onsite and online were healthy, although we continue to note with concern the impact of changes to the school curriculum in prior years upon applications and routes taken by school leavers.

Collaboration and innovation continued to be key aspects of SMO's activities throughout the year:

- Ann an com-pàirt ri MG ALBA agus Bòrd na Gàidhlig, chaidh am pròiseact Speak Gaelic a chur air chois san Dàmhair 2021. - In partnership with MG Alba and Bòrd na Gàidhlig, the Speak Gaelic project launched in October 2021. SMO has had an integral role here, including in the development of materials and ensuring coherence with standard linguistic frameworks.

- A new partnership with Duolingo has contributed to opening up Gaelic to millions of new learners, as well as ensuring that this new entry point to Gaelic leads smoothly into established learning pathways.
- Tha barrachd chothroman againn do dh'oileanaich theagaisg a-nis, às dèidh dhuinn barantachadh fhaighinn air cùrsaichean leithid, MEd ann am Foghlam Gàidhlig. Tha sinn an dòchas leis an leudachadh seo gun urrainn dhuinn cuideachadh le bhith a' cur ris an àireimh de thidsearan Gàidhlig ùra air feadh Alba gus frithealadh air an iarrtas airson foghlam tro mheadhan na Gàidhlig.
- New course validations, such as the MEd in Gaelic Education, have expanded our educational repertoire. We look forward to building upon this work to make a greater contribution to increasing the supply of new Gaelic medium teachers across Scotland, a vital resource required to meet demand for Gaelic medium education.

- Our fostering of a network organisation for Gaelic development officers promises to provide opportunities for effective sharing of resources and learning as well as developing connectedness and resilience in these key roles.

Legal Status

Sabhal Mòr Ostaig (the College) was established in 1973 and registered in 1978 as a Charitable Educational Trust for the purpose of promoting education and study of the Gaelic Language among Gaelic and non-Gaelic speaking communities throughout the world. In June 2009 a Company limited by Guarantee was formed and the entire undertaking of the Trust and operation of the College was transferred to the Company with effect from 1 August 2009. The Company has been given permission to exclude the word 'Limited' from its title. The College is a registered charity (Scottish Charity Number SC 002578) for the purposes of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005.

Scope of the Consolidated Financial Statements

The Consolidated Financial Statements cover all activities of the College, including those of its subsidiary Company, Sabhal Mòr Ostaig (Developments) Limited. The Consolidated Statement of Comprehensive Income covers the results for the year from 1 August 2021.

Student Numbers

The vast majority of students completed their studies successfully and all staff and students deserve credit for their efforts to ensure a safe learning environment during the past session which was again impacted by Covid restrictions.

Undergraduate

SMO achieved its target of 102 FTEs Scottish Domiciled Taught Students for 2021-22, a growth of 20% from 2020-21. The distance-learning course, CertHE An Cùrsa Adhartais, continues to grow with a total of 121 students registered (110 in 2020-21). The total number of Undergraduate FTEs for 2021-22 is 138 FTEs as compared to 124 FTEs in 2020-21.

Taught Postgraduate

We continued to lead the delivery of the PGCert/Dip Streap in partnership with the University of Aberdeen. We exceeded our target of 12 students for 2021-22, and with the support of the Scottish Government, were able to offer places to an additional two students for this award.

Further Education

The 2021/22 FE credit target of 799 per SMO's Outcome Agreement was exceeded with 938 credits achieved (2020/21: 910), With the return of some Short Courses in 2021/22, the split between An Cùrsa Inntrigidh and Short Courses was 90%:10% (2020/21: 100% An Cùrsa Inntrigidh as there were no onsite Short Courses that year due to Covid). Foundation Apprenticeships have continued in Digital Media and Children and Young People.

Short Courses 2022

Our Short Courses Team delivered a range of online and face-to-face courses over the past session. They delivered Seachdain nan Teaghlach, Gaelic Family Week, in an online format over three days and Seachdain nan Deugairean, Gaelic Teenagers Week, in partnership with the Highland Council.

The Easter Short Courses programme attracted a lower number of students this year, with 100 attending, as Covid still impacted on the running of classes. Although class numbers were still restricted Summer Short Courses in 2022 attracted greater numbers, with 380 enrolled, creating much more of a buzz on campus.

Teaching and Learning Developments

We made good progress with priorities for 2021/22. We are continuing the programme of work following the Gaelic and Related Studies review with planned re-approval of the Scheme in Academic Year 2022/23. We continue to focus on developing our student engagement activity by working in partnership with Comann nan Oileanach.

We are making significant contributions to adult language and community learning provision, through the redevelopment of our flagship course, An Cùrsa Inntrigidh, and through leading the academic content creation for SpeakGaelic. We were also pleased to be one of the first course providers of SpeakGaelic classes, launched in October 2021.

We have also entered into a contract with Duolingo in order to build on the fantastic work done by the Duolingo Gaelic Development Team over the past years.

The team is now involved in the development of B1 and B2 materials, as well as supporting the roll-out of community classes.
- An Cùrsa Inntrigidh we appointed a new fulltime Course Co-ordinator to oversee the development of An Cùrsa Inntrigidh, including training and tutor support and the creation and expansion of digital resources.
- Curriculum Review We progressed the development of a new BA Gaelic degree with specialist options, with approval scheduled for session 22/23.
- We successfully launched the PDA in Sgilean Eadar-theangachaidh (Translation Skills) in October 2021, with a cohort of 9 students.
- A new four-year teacher education degree
 BA(Hons) Gaelic and Education programme
 was approved and will be delivered from 22/23.
- We renewed two continued professional development courses in Language Development and Community Development.
- We approved an MEd in Gaelic Medium Education in May 2022. The course is being delivered in the current session.
- We were approved to offer the SVQ2 and SVQ3 in Social Care – Children and Young People.
- Partnerships we are in the process of renewing our partnership agreements with University of Cape Breton and the Gaelic College Nova Scotia.
 We will shortly be seeking to renew agreements for student exchanges with the University of Edinburgh and Limerick University, Ireland. We are delighted to have agreed a Memorandum of Understanding to guide our partnership work with

Research activities

Research Excellence Framework 2021 submission UHI's submission to the Modern Languages and Linguistics category consisted of nine Gaelic researchers, eight from SMO's research team and one based in the Language Sciences Institute, Inverness. Their work covered an extensive range of subjects including Gaelic language, literature, music, history, philosophy and art, education, and the use of Gaelic in present-day communities.

Overall, the Modern Languages and Linguistics submission achieved a markedly improved rating compared to its previous submission in 2014. This time, 77% of its research has been judged to be in the highest categories—world leading or internationally excellent—contrasting with the 61% secured in 2014. 86.7% of the team's published work was placed in the two highest ratings, with 20% assessed as world-leading, and 66.7% internationally excellent. The remaining 13.3% was rated very good.

Postgraduate students

SMO has continued to strengthen postgraduate provision and numbers. We achieved significant success in this year's awards of PhD funding, receiving three new awards from national funding bodies; one studentship (full-time) through SGSAH's Open competition, one (part-time) through the Carnegie Trust, and one (full-time) through the AHRC's Collaborative Doctoral Award Scheme, in partnership with National Museums Scotland. These add to our existing SGSAH CDA studentship, bringing our current total of PhD students to four (one additional final-year student has submitted his PhD and will undergo his viva voce examination before Christmas). SMO's first MRes student successfully defended her MRes thesis in April 2022, and we have one continuing and one new MRes student.

In June 2022 SMO (in partnership with Celtic and Gaelic, University of Glasgow and the National Trust

Lectures and publications

SMO staff have continued to play an important part in national and international research communities, and have delivered plenary and keynote lectures at the Royal Irish Academy (Stiùbhart), the World Congress of Scottish Literatures, Prague (Mac a' Phearsain), as well as contributing research talks and collaborations to key cultural events and organisations across the Highlands and Scotland more widely, including Ceòlas (Cheape), Blàs (Stiùbhart), Faclan (Cheape), Scottish National Jazz Orchestra (Bateman).

Significant publications over the year include Prof. Richard Cox's Ainmean Tuineachaidh Leòdhais/The Settlement Names of Lewis, which received the Donald Meek Prize from the Gaelic Books Council as the best non-fiction book of 2022, and a series of significant articles of on seventeenth and eighteenth century Scottish Gaelic literature by Dr Domhnall Uilleam Stiùbhart as contributions to *The Oxford History of British and Irish Catholicism, Volume II: Uncertainty and Change, 1641–1745*, and *The Edinburgh Companion to Scottish Literature in the Long Eighteenth Century.*

Research Projects

Ceum-bàrdachd Gàidhlig – SMO was successful in its application to the Knowledge Exchange Innovation Fund at UHI to develop a Gaelic poetry trail for the Isle of Skye with support from Visit Scotland. This project will utilise digital maps and augmented reality to enable visitors to explore literary heritage as they travel through the island.

Aiseag, a collaborative project between SMO researchers and Tobar an Dualchais, exploring the provision and impact of Gaelic cultural education in GME settings, was completed; interviews with teachers were completed at selected schools in Skye and the Western Isles, and TaD produced printed and audio-visual resources, conducting a programme of workshops with students in P6-S2.

Gaelic Officers Network

Sabhal Mòr Ostaig, in collaboration with the University of Aberdeen and Comunn na Gàidhlig, were successful in winning a contract from Bòrd na Gàidhlig to set up a new national network of Gaelic development officers. During the past year the network was established and run, and now the draft final report has been submitted to Bòrd na Gàidhlig. Also, the network has now been successfully transferred to the officers themselves for them to take forward, as Scotland's first professional development network for Gaelic language officers.

Estates Developments

The College continued to make steady progress on a range of its agreed estates and capital maintenance priorities for the year. These included:

- The complete redecoration of 48 student bedrooms, shared public spaces and 3 teaching rooms at the College's Àrainn Chaluim Chille shoreside campus. This comprised painting, new floor coverings and new bedroom furniture;
- The purchase and installation, with the help of grant assistance from Cycle Scotland, of 2 new purpose-built cycle storage sheds to help with the College's ongoing promotion of the health and wellbeing benefits of cycling to its students, staff and visitors;
- Work continued to formalise the adoption by the relevant public agencies of the College's water treatment works and roads infrastructure at Kilbeg. This is crucial in unlocking the opportunities for further capital development of the site which include in the short-term a new 8-berth community facility for campervan parking and servicing; and a further phase of much-needed new community housing of up to 14 units;
- The College continued to make good progress in meeting its target for reducing its carbon footprint and associated carbon emissions from its ongoing operations and associated consumption of energy, water, refuse, staff and student travel. The College's gross carbon emissions for the year as reported to The Scottish Government was calculated as 302 tonnes CO2:

- The College needs to undertake major and urgent repairs to its Fàs Centre for Creative & Cultural Industries, which was closed for use during the year, due to these issues. These include measures to repair the long-running effects of significant water ingress; and the strengthening of key sections of masonry panels and structural steel as have been found to be under-engineered. The College commissioned crucial technical investigations in the year to inform the work to all these areas of the building while in parallel discussions with our capital funding partners are continuing.

Fiosrachadh air a' Chill Bhig, baile ùr le taigheadas

Bidh na dachaighean seo rim faotainn aig prìs reusanta le measgachadh de roghainnean seilbh is gabhaltais, agus nas cudromaiche buileach cuidichidh seo leis mar a tha taigheadas aig prìs reusanta cho fìor ghann san sgìre. Leabharlann Nàiseanta na Gàidhlig

Chaidh an leabharlann a th' ann an-dràsta a thogail ann an 1998, agus tha e air a bhith na ghoireas glè fheumail bho chaidh a thogail do dh'oileanaich, luchd-obrach acadaimigeach agus do dhaoine eile; agus tha e na dhachaigh do chruinneachaidhean de leabhraichean tearc agus fìor phrìseil, cruinneachaidhean aig a bheil cliù eadar-nàiseanta agus a chaidh a thrusadh thairis air còrr is leth-cheud bliadhna le bhith a' ceannach leabhraichean agus ri linn fialaidheachd nan daoine a thug feadhainn dhuinn mar thiodhlac.

Update on Kilbeg village housing development

Kilbeg Village, the first new, planned village in Skye in over 100 years, is an ambitious development which aims to create a vibrant, economically active and sustainable rural community which, in line with Sabhal Mòr Ostaig's core aims and mission, will have Gaelic language and culture at its heart.

Through our innovative partnership with Highland Council, the Communities Housing Trust and private sector contractor, James MacQueen's Ltd, the next phase of the development will see the delivery of a further 29 units of affordable housing offering a mix of ownership and tenancy models and, most importantly, will help address the chronic shortage of affordable housing in the area. Work is now beginning on site in Autumn 2022.

National Gaelic library

Sir Iain Noble, the original founder of the College, described creating a Gaelic library in the West of Scotland as 'the original inspiration' for Sabhal Mòr Ostaig.

Built in 1998, the existing library has ably fulfilled its promise over its lifespan, serving the student body, academic staff and other users well; and enabling the building up of its international-standard holdings of rare and irreplaceable collections accumulated over half a century through purchase and generous donation.

SMO is committed to developing this important new facility as 'national asset', with the aim of creating the first national Gaelic library for Scotland. Much of the early work in this regard has centred around developing key strategic partnerships with other libraries and, in particular, a strengthening of the strategic partnership between SMO library and the National Library of Scotland (NLS) The proposals have also been the subject of detailed discussions with a wide range of senior Scottish Government and UK Government Ministers and Officials, and the proposal has been extremely favourably received by all.

Pròiseactan nàiseanta

Faclair na Gàidhlig

Bha atharraichean ann aig Faclair na Gàidhlig ann an 2021-22. Leig an Stiùiriche Faclaireachd dhith a dreuchd às dèidh cha mhòr 20 bliadhna san dreuchd san luchar 2022. Mar ullachadh airson sin, chaidh bùithtean-obrach a chumail do luchd-obrach agus do Bhuill nan Comataidhean le neach-comhairle bhon taobh a-muigh gus beachdachadh air planaichean airson an ama ri teachd, agus gus cuideachadh le bhith a' dealbh a' phlana ghnìomhachais a tha ga dheasachadh airson na h-ùine Lùnastal 2023 luchar 2028. Rinneadh adhartas le bhith a' cruthachadh siostam tarraing is sgrìobhaidh a dh'aona-ghnothach airson an fhaclair, agus bha Sgioba nan Siostaman agus an Sgioba Faclaireachd ag obair gu dlùth còmhla gus dèanamh cinnteach gun tèid frithealadh air feumalachdan an fhaclair. Tha an obair seo a' leantainn, tha agus an obair gus prionnsapalan faclaireachd a stèidheachadh, gus sampaill de dh'fhaclan agus bun-fhiosrachadh mu na teacsaichean a chruthachadh, agus gus an corpas a leudachadh. Cuideachd, thathar fhathast a' dèanamh tar-sgrìobhadh air clàraidhean, às dèidh dhan Treas Pàirt den phròiseact thar-sgrìobhaidh, Beairteas a Bharrachd, a bhith deiseil - compàirteachas le Tobar an Dualchais. Chaidh maoineachadh a ghleidheadh airson bliadhna eile den obair seo tro bhith a' dèanamh ath-dhealbh air buidseatan.

National projects

Sabhal Mòr Ostaig, as the National Centre for Gaelic Language and Culture, is the host and lead partner in a number of national, longitudinal Gaelic language and culture-based research and knowledge exchange projects, which are described below.

Faclair na Gàidhlig / Dictionary of the Scottish Gaelic Language

Faclair na Gàidhlig has undergone a period of change in 2021-22. The Director of Lexicography of almost 20 years retired in July 2022. In preparation for this, Staff and Committee workshops took place with an external consultant to elaborate on plans for the future of the project, to input into the business plan being prepared for the five-year period from August 2023 - July 2028. Progress was made on the development of a bespoke excerpting and dictionary writing system, with close collaboration between the Systems Development and Lexicographical teams to ensure the requirements of the dictionary are met. This work is ongoing, as is work on the development of lexicographical principles, on the creation of sample entries and textual metadata, and on corpus expansion. Transcription of oral material is also ongoing following the conclusion of Phase Three of the transcription project, Beairteas a Bharrachd, in partnership with Tobar an Dualchais. Funding was secured for a further year for this work through a budget realignment.

A thuilleadh air an obair leantainnich gus barrachd chlàraidhean a chatalogadh agus a chur ris an làraich-lìn, tha TaD air a bhith an sàs ann an grunn phròiseactan inntinneach ann an coimhearsnachdan ann an 2021/22. Nam measg bha bùithtean-obrach mu dhualchas ann an sgoiltean ann an Uibhist, Leòdhas agus san Eilean Sgitheanach far an robh an sgioba a' coimhead air sgeulachdan cocheangailte ri sgìre na cloinne agus a' cleachdadh diofar sheòrsaichean ealain gus sin a dhèanamh. Cuideachd, chaidh trì tachartasan a chur air dòigh aig Fèis Bhlas le TaD far an deach a h-uile tiogaid a reic - aig aonan dhiubh ann an Ceann a Tuath an Eilein Sgitheanaich dh'ionnsaich daoine bhon choimhearsnachd òrain ionadail agus sheinn iad iad agus iad air èisteachd ri clàraidhean dhiubh air TaD. Tha Soillse stèidhichte aig Sabhal Mòr Ostaig agus tha am pròiseact air a lìbhrigeadh tro chompàirteachas eadar Oilthigh Obar Dheathain, Oilthigh Dhùn Èideann, Oilthigh Ghlaschu, Oilthigh Cailleanach Ghlaschu, Oilthigh Heriot Watt, Oilthigh Srath Chluaidh agus Oilthigh na Gàidhealtachd agus nan Eilean.

Tha e mar dhleastanas rannsachaidh do Shoillse taic a thoirt dhan iomairt gus cànan is cultar na Gàidhlig a ghleidheadh agus ath-bheothachadh. 'S e

Tobar an Dualchais / Kist o Riches (TaD / KoR)
Tobar an Dualchais - Kist o Riches (TAD) is
Scotland's online resource dedicated to the
presentation and promotion of audio recordings of
Scotland's cultural heritage. Its principal content,
including songs, music, history, poetry, traditions
and stories from the 1930s onwards, is made up of
material from three main archives: The School of
Scottish Studies, The Canna Collection and BBC
Radio nan Gàidheal and currently includes over
46,000 individual recordings in Gaelic, Scots and
English.

Alongside the continued work to catalogue and add more recordings to the website, TAD has been involved in a number of exciting outreach projects during 2021/22. These include cultural heritage workshops in schools in Uist, Lewis and Skye where the team used a range of creative art activities to engage children with the stories of their place. Three sold out events were also organised by TAD as part of the Blas Festival - including one in the North of Skye where members of the community learnt and performed local songs using recordings available on TAD. Other successful initiatives included the TAD artist in residence, developed in collaboration with ATLAS Arts, which culminated in an exhibition and talk by the artist at Sabhal Mòr Ostaig. Working with leading Scottish storytellers two public events were also delivered at the Scottish Storytelling Centre which highlighted a range of traditional tales from the website.

Despite these engaging new outreach initiatives, and the wider importance of TAD as a major cultural heritage asset, core funding remains a major concern. Progress has however been made with senior Scottish Government Ministers and Officials with an agreement in the pipeline.

Soillse

Soillse is based at Sabhal Mòr Ostaig and is delivered through a partnership with the Universities of Aberdeen, Edinburgh, Glasgow, Glasgow Caledonian, Heriot Watt, Strathclyde and the University of the Highlands and Islands.

Soillse has a research remit to support the maintenance and revitalisation of Gaelic language and culture. Its founding aim is to support a research

- Continued support for and participation in other projects, including Automatic Speech Recognition (led by Edinburgh), Leacan corpus development (led by Glasgow), Stòras Beò nan Gàidheal (SMO/LSI) community recordings, Mediating Multilingualism (LSI-led with University partners in India and Jamaica), COOL (SMO with European partners) developments in Computer Assisted Language Learning through the Clilstore platform. COOL and Mediating Multilingualism both came to a close at the end of 2021, the latter culminating in a series of "Talking Points with Norman Maclean" webinars including Jamaican and Indian scholars as well as SMO and UHI staff, and UK-based heritage language speakers from Caribbean and South Asian as well as Hebridean backgrounds, in which extracts from the Saoghal Thormoid projects were used to stimulate discussion of issues of common interest in relation to Language Endangerment, Language Hierarchies, and Language Contact. Further synergies were also developed through COOL with innovative work on Custom Dictionaries in the project's final months for under-resourced languages like Jamaican and Okinawan.

Ainmean-Àite na h-Alba (AÀA) is the national advisory partnership for Gaelic place-names in Scotland. Its primary aim is to provide correct and consistent forms of Gaelic place-names for signage and other published materials. This includes an online database of researched place-names which is available to the public.

AÀA continues to provide an invaluable service advising on place names to a broad number of groups, including Councils, National Parks and Bòrd Na Gàidhlig. 12 out of 19 Gaelic Plan maps have now been completed and are available on the AÀA website. It is expected the remaining maps will be completed in the Autumn of 2022, and will be promoted in liaison with BnG. AÀA has also been working on compiling a list of parish names in Scotland for shared use with Tobar An Dualchais, whilst we are also now working with Ordinance Survey on the OS Gaelic Names Policy, and use of dual naming across OS maps.

AÀA has continued successfully to deliver talks and lectures on line, including a commissioned talk on the coastal names of the Rhinns of Galloway, and on Moray place-names as part of Seachdain na Gàidhlig. A series of place-name tweets were created for Highland Council as part of Seachdain na Gàidhlig. The online Short Course on Scottish Place Names has been very popular with participants this year.

Work on material for publication continues, with transcription of place-name material in Diack's notebooks complete, work on a effectively a sequel to Watson's Scottish Place-name papers is nearing completion, and a first draft on Loch Lomond place names is being proofed for publication.

Arts Development

Sabhal Mòr Ostaig continues to develop and support opportunities for Gaelic artists to come to work within a supported and immersed Gaelic language community. Over the years, Sabhal Mòr Residency

Ge-tà, tha sinn ag obair gus fuasgladh fhaighinn air na duilgheadasan seo agus tha sinn an dòchas gum bi am prògram le luchd-ealain air mhuinntireas a' tòiseachadh a-rithist cho luath 's as urrainnear.

Artists have gone on to be hugely influential in the development of the Gaelic Arts and in inspiring successive cohorts of young and aspiring Gaelic Artists. Sabhal Mòr has delivered many of its programmes through developing strategic partnerships with a wide range of arts providers, at local, regional, national, and international levels. Sabhal Mòr Ostaig also runs a highly successful international visual arts residency in partnership with the New York based Jon Schueler Trust, attracting interest from internationally renowned visual arts practitioners, placing SMO very firmly on the international visual arts map. Covid related issues of course impacted heavily on this work and further to that, the forced closure of the Fas Centre for Media and the Creative and Cultural industries, in which the artist's residencies were all housed has led to a postponement of the programme currently. We are however working to resolve these issues and would hope to have the residency programme up and running again as soon as possible.

Future Developments

As outlined in the Chair's report, SMO has, in the past year, done a huge amount of work to discuss and draw up its new strategy for 2023-28; in the past year the first stage of this was completed, prior to the completion of the final stage and the strategy publication in the coming year. Sabhal Mòr Ostaig also contributed to the creation of the Scottish Government's next National Gaelic Language Plan through sending in a formal submission to the consultation process. Sabhal Mòr Ostaig is firmly committed to helping the Scottish Government deliver its priorities in the new National Gaelic Language Plan from 2023 onwards.

- Completion and launch of the new SMO Strategy 2023-28, focussing on securing SSI status and developing further SMO's role as the National Centre for Gaelic Language and Culture
- · Establishment of an academic senate

Financial review

The Consolidated Statement of Comprehensive Income for the year ending 31 July 2022 is set out on page 39 of this report.

2021-22 has been a steady year financially for SMO, as it has been a good year in terms of student numbers both on and off campus, and the College benefitted from being able to keep its campus open all year, after the Covid lockdowns that affected the previous 2 financial years. There is a resulting surplus of £96,910 after charging depreciation and crediting related deferred capital grant release

There has been a continuing impact of Covid on the College's ability to raise commercial income from its campus, as due to on-going uncertainties during the winter of 2021/22, it was not possible to plan for full occupancy on site. Moreover there was still a degree of hesitancy around events, with a number of conferences postponing for a further year. The College still benefitted from additional grant support for the sector from Scottish Government, although this funding will be removed going forward into 2022/23. Short courses were able to return to campus at Easter and during the Summer, albeit it a reduced capacity. Savings have continued to be made from vacant staff positions as well as different ways of working due to Covid reducing travel and other office costs.

Exceptional items:

SMO had its extensive library collection, which includes rare collections of Gaelic books revalued during the year, leading to an adjustment of £323,475 of Heritage Assets recorded in the reserves. In addition, SMO's substantial art collection, which has been donated by artists and benefactors over the years, has been valued and recognised in the Statutory Accounts for the first time, with a value of £238,950.

In addition, the Fàs Building, which as noted above requires substantial repairs, has been temporarily impaired by £4,127,487, along with the related capital grants to the asset; this has a net zero impact on the surplus and reserves of the College. Once the necessary works have been carried out, the value of the asset should be reverted.

The Group's closing reserves saw an increase to £2,265,882 (2020/21: £1,606,547).

Cash Flows and Liquidity

During the year the Group had net cash outflow of £291,850 (2020/21 cash inflow of £677,721), reflecting the lower level of creditors held at year end.

Taxation Status

Based on the strategic plan, the College undertakes periodic, comprehensive reviews of the risks to which the College is exposed. The risk policy and procedures were revised and updated during the year. The risk register is reviewed on a quarterly basis to identify and measure known risks by strategic area, and state what mitigating action will be taken to reduce any potential impact on the College. Progress against risk mitigation actions is then reviewed quarterly. In addition, the College will also consider any risks which may arise as a result of a new area of work being undertaken. The College has also addressed specific Covid-19 risks as part of the risk register.

This cannot be done without a degree of innovation and pushing against the existing status quo, which involves accepting the risks involved. The Board expect management to take sensible measures to understand and mitigate where possible, but not to the point where action is stymied by over-caution.

Public Sector funding

The College has considerable reliance on continued Scottish Government funding, both direct and through its agencies. In 2021/22, some 79% (2020/21 - 61%) of the College's total revenue was ultimately public funded through grants for the provision of teaching Gaelic and cultural activities. This level of funding will continue due to the educational nature of SMO's work, but there can be no assurance that government policy or practice will remain the same; it is noted that the current government has agreed to effective flat funding for the sector for the next 5 years, whilst facing a high inflation economic environment.

- Close monitoring of actuals against budget with Scenario Planning for budget shortfalls.

2. Student Numbers

The College is dependent on a steady stream of students, both residential and distance learners, who wish to study through the medium of Gaelic. Any reduction in new intake has an impact for the succeeding three or four years. There has been a significant reduction in the number of school pupils taking a Gaelic Higher since 2012 affecting primarily HE student numbers, although there has been an improvement in intake numbers in 2021/22.

Mitigation measures include:

- Comprehensive marketing and regular communication with secondary school departments
- Increasing direct engagement by teaching staff with schools throughout the year
- Continuing to develop the curriculum offer to meet changing market requirements, with a focus on Gaelic teacher training and professional development
- Lobbying government to support Gaelic uptake and provision in secondary schools

3. The Fàs Building / Commercial Letting Activity In early 2022 SMO made the difficult decision to close the Fàs Building to ensure there was no risk to individual users, due to issues highlighted on a technical engineering report commissioned to

The College is not directly affected by Brexit in terms of funding exposures, beyond the contributory impact of Brexit on poor economic conditions. The College's Governing Body, which is recruited by open advertisement and by recommendation according to skillset needs, meets four times a year and has several committees including an Academic Committee, a Corporate Committee, a Finance and Estates Committee, a Remuneration Committee and an Audit Committee. All of these Committees are formally constituted with terms of reference. They comprise members of the Governing body and outside experts. Member training is carried out by induction and regularly thereafter.

The Finance and Estates committee inter alia recommends to the Governing Body the College's annual revenue and capital budgets and monitors performance in relation to the approved budgets. The Audit Committee meets three times a year and liaises with the College's external and internal auditors. The Committee considers detailed reports together with recommendations for the improvement of the College's systems of internal control and management's responses and implementation plans. It also receives and considers reports from the Scottish Funding Council as they affect the College's business and monitor adherence to the regulatory requirements. Whilst senior executives attend meetings of the Audit Committee as necessary, they are not members of the Committee

Day to day operation of the College is delegated to the senior management team who receive reports setting out key performance and risk indicators and considers possible control issues brought to their attention by early warning mechanisms which are embedded within the operational teams and reinforced by risk awareness training. The Audit Committee's role is confined to a high level review of the arrangements for internal financial control. The Governing Body's agenda includes a regular item for consideration of risk and control and receives reports thereon from the senior management team and the Audit Committee. The emphasis is on obtaining the relevant degree of assurance and not merely reporting by exception.

1. General information

Sabhal Mòr Ostaig is a private charitable company limited by guarantee, incorporated and registered in Scotland. Its registered office address is Colaiste Gaidhlig Na H-Alba An Teanga, Sleite, An T-Eilean Sgitheanach, IV44 8RQ. It's principal activity is that of a College.

2. Accounting policies

2.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Accounts Direction for Scottish Colleges 2021-22, statement of recommended practice: Accounting for Further and Higher Education 2019 (the 2019 FE/HE SORP) and in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102 the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland" (FRS102). The College is a public benefit entity and has therefore applied the relevant public benefit requirements of FRS 102.

The preparation of financial statements in compliance with FRS102 requires the use of certain critical accounting estimates. It also requires management to exercise judgements in applying the College's accounting policies.

The financial statements are presented in GBP and rounded to the nearest £1.

The following principle accounting policies have been applied:

2.2 Basis of consolidation

The consolidated financial statements present the results of the College and its own subsidiaries ("the Group") as if they form a single entity. Intercompany transactions and balances between group companies are therefore eliminated in full.

The consolidated financial statements incorporate the results of business combinations using the purchase method. In the Balance Sheet, the acquiree's identifiable assets, liabilities and contingent liabilities are initially recognised at their fair values at the acquisition date. The results of acquired operations are included in the Consolidated Statement of Comprehensive Income from the date on which control is obtained. They are deconsolidated from the date control ceases.

The accounts of non-trading subsidiary Cànan Alba Limited, together with its own subsidiary Cànan Limited, are excluded from consolidation on the grounds that their inclusion would not be material for the point of providing a true and fair view.

Exemptions

The following exemptions have been taken in these financial statements:

- The College has taken advantage of the exemptions provided in FRS 102 1.12 and the 2019 FE/HE SORP Paras 14-16, and has not included a separate statement of its own cash flows. These cash flows are included within the Consolidated Statement of Cash Flows, and the College balance sheet discloses cash at both the current and preceding reporting dates.
- A separate Statement of Comprehensive Income is not presented for the College itself as permitted by section 408 of the Companies Act 2006 and paragraph 3.3 of the SORP.

2.3 Going concern

In preparing these financial statements, the Board of Directors have given careful consideration to current and anticipated future solvency requirements of the College and its ability to continue as a going concern for the foreseeable future. The directors have prepared the financial statements on a going concern basis, notwithstanding the current economic downturn and net current liabilities of £350,259. The directors have prepared cash flow forecasts for a period beyond 12 months from the date of approval of these financial statements which indicate that, taking account of reasonable possible downturns, the College will have sufficient funds, through its operating cash flows, cash reserves and bank overdraft to meet its liabilities as they fall due for that period.

2.4 Revenue

Revenue is recognised to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Group and the revenue can be reliably measured. Revenue is measured as the fair value of the consideration received or receivable, excluding discounts, rebates, value added tax and other sales taxes. The following criteria must also be met before revenue is recognised:

Income from tuition fees is recognised in the period for which it is received and includes all fees chargeable to students or their sponsors. No fees are waived by the College.

Income from grants, contracts and other services rendered is stated after VAT and net of any discounts and is recognised in the Statement of Comprehensive income in proportion to the extent of completion of the contract or service concerned. This is generally equivalent to the sum of the relevant expenditure incurred during the year and any related contributions to overhead costs. All income from short-term deposits is credited to the Statement of Comprehensive Income in the period in which it is earned.

The main annual recurrent allocation from SFC, which is intended to meet recurrent costs, is credited direct to the Statement of Comprehensive Income during the period in which it is receivable.

Grants received in respect of capital additions are credited to deferred capital grants in the Balance Sheet and amortised to the Statement of Comprehensive Income over the lives of the assets concerned.

2.5 Finance costs

Finance costs are charged to profit or loss over the term of the debt using the effective interest method so that the amount charged is at a constant rate on the carrying amount. Issue costs are initially recognised as a reduction in the proceeds of the associated capital instrument.

2.6 Borrowing costs

All borrowing costs are recognised in profit or loss in the year in which they are incurred.

Accounting policies (continued) 2.7 Fixed assets and depreciation

Land and buildings

The College's buildings are specialised buildings and therefore it is not appropriate to value them on the basis of open market value. Land and buildings are included in the balance sheet at cost. Freehold land is not depreciated. Freehold buildings are depreciated over their expected useful economic life to the Group at the rate of 2%-4% per annum on a straight-line basis.

Where land and buildings are acquired with the aid of specific grants they are capitalised and depreciated as above. The related grants are credited to a deferred capital grant account within creditors and are released to the statement of comprehensive income over the expected useful economic life of the related asset on a basis consistent with the depreciation policy. The deferred income is allocated between creditors due within one year and due after more than one year.

At each reporting date the College assesses whether there is any indication of impairment. If such indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset is determined which is the higher of its fair value less costs to sell and its value in use. An impairment loss is recognised where the carrying amount exceeds the recoverable amount.

Equipment

Equipment costing less than £1,000 per individual item is written off as an expense in the year of acquisition. All other equipment is capitalised at cost unless there is sufficient reason to write it off as an expense. Capitalised equipment is depreciated over its useful economic life as follows on the written down value basis:

Motor vehicles, general equipment and furnishings 25% per annum

Where equipment is acquired with the aid of specific grants it is capitalised and depreciated in accordance with the above policy, with the related grant being credited to a deferred capital grant account within creditors and released as income in the statement of comprehensive income over the useful economic life of the related equipment. The deferred income is allocated between creditors due within one year and due after more than one year.

Heritage asset

The College holds and conserves a number of special collections of library books. As from 1 August 2016, regular purchases of library books are written off as an educational expense in the statement of comprehensive income. The net book value of books acquired prior to the date of change, including where appropriate revalued special collections are carried forward at deemed cost, with special collections acquired thereafter being added at cost. Heritage Assets are not depreciated as their long economic life and high residual value means that any depreciation would not be material.

In the current year, the College revalued a collection of visual art which has been included in the financial statements. As with the library books, these are not depreciated as their long economic life and high residual value means that any depreciation would not be material.

2.8 Valuation of investments

Investments in subsidiaries are measured at cost less accumulated impairment.

2.9 Pensions

A contributory group stakeholder's pension scheme is open to all staff, to which the College makes contributions in proportion to members' own level of contributions; the College contributions are charged to the statement of comprehensive income. The majority of staff have opted to join the scheme. New rules came into effect in 2012 whereby from May 2015, all other staff are automatically enrolled into the scheme at the minimum permitted level, unless they specifically opt out

Retirement benefits to some employees of the College are provided by the Teachers' Superannuation Scheme (Scotland) (STSS). This scheme is externally funded and contracted out of the State Earnings Related Pension Scheme.

Contributions to the scheme are charged to the statement of comprehensive income so as to spread the cost of pensions over employees' working

lives with the College in such a way that the pension cost is a substantially level percentage of current and future pensionable payroll.

2.10 Stocks

Stocks are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value, being the estimated selling price less costs to complete and sell. Cost is based on the cost of purchase on a first in, first out basis. Work in progress and finished goods include labour and attributable overheads.

At each balance sheet date, stocks are assessed for impairment. If stock is impaired, the carrying amount is reduced to its selling price less costs to complete and sell. The impairment loss is recognised immediately in profit or loss.

2.11 Debtors

Short term debtors are measured at transaction price, less any impairment. Loans receivable are measured initially at fair value, net of transaction costs, and are measured subsequently at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less any impairment.

2.12 Cash and cash equivalents

Cash is represented by cash in hand and deposits with financial institutions repayable without penalty on notice of not more than 24 hours. Cash equivalents are highly liquid investments that mature in no more than three months from the date of acquisition and that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash with insignificant risk of change in value.

In the Consolidated Statement of Cash Flows, cash and cash equivalents are shown net of bank overdrafts that are repayable on demand and form an integral part of the Group's cash management.

2.13 Creditors

Short term creditors are measured at the transaction price. Other financial liabilities, including bank loans, are measured initially at fair value, net of transaction costs, and are measured subsequently at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

2.14 Financial instruments

The Group only enters into basic financial instrument transactions that result in the recognition of financial assets and liabilities like trade and other debtors and creditors, loans from banks and other third parties, loans to related parties and investments in ordinary shares.

Accounting policies (continued) Financial Instruments (continued)

Debt instruments (other than those wholly repayable or receivable within one year), including loans and other accounts receivable and payable, are initially measured at present value of the future cash flows and subsequently at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

Debt instruments that are payable or receivable within one year, typically trade debtors and creditors, are measured, initially and subsequently, at the undiscounted amount of the cash or other consideration expected to be paid or received.

However, if the arrangements of a short-term instrument constitute a financing transaction, like the payment of a trade debt deferred beyond normal business terms or in case of an out-right short-term loan that is not at market rate, the financial asset or liability is measured, initially at the present value of future cash flows discounted at a market rate of interest for a similar debt instrument and subsequently at amortised cost, unless it qualifies as a loan from a director in the case of a small company, or a public benefit entity concessionary loan.

For financial assets measured at cost less impairment, the impairment loss is measured as the difference between an asset's carrying amount and best estimate of the recoverable amount, which is an approximation of the amount that the Group would receive for the asset if it were to be sold at the balance sheet date.

2.15 Judgements in applying policies and key sources of estimation uncertainty

The preparation of these financial statements require management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of policies and reported amounts of assets and liabilities, income and expenses.

Judgements and estimates are continually evaluated and are based on historical experiences and other factors, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances.

The College makes estimates and assumptions concerning the future. The resulting accounting estimates will, by definition, seldom equal the related actual results. The estimates and assumptions that have a significant risk of causing a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities within the next financial year as discussed below:

Impairment of the Fas Building

In the current year, the College has impaired the value of the Fàs Building as it requires a significant amount of repairs. The building has been professionally valued to assist with the impairment assessment and resulted in the value of the building being impaired by £4,127k. The assumptions used by the external valuers are their best estimates, however, are subject to judgement.

Heritage Assets

Heritage asset values within the accounts are assessed annually by the directors. Valuations are based on external experts valuations derived from their expected current market value. There is a degree of judgement involved in that the value of the assets will ultimately be determined by the market.

Accounting policies (continued)

2.16 Taxation

The company is a charitable company within the meaning of Paragraph 1 Schedule 6 of the Finance Act 2010. Accordingly, the company is potentially exempt from taxation in respect of income or capital gains received within categories covered by Chapter 3 of Part 11 of the Corporation Tax Act 2012 and section 256 of the Taxation of Chargeable Gains Act 1992 to the extent that such income or gains are applied for charitable purposes only.

The subsidiary companies, Sabhal Mòr Ostaig (Developments) Limited and Bail' Ùr Ostaig are subject to corporation tax in the same way as any commercial organisation. Cànan Alba Limited has charitable status but does not trade. Its trading subsidiary, Cànan Limited, is subject to corporation tax.
